Alternative Education Programs

One hundred percent of the Alternative Education Program staff were present and introduced themselves to the Board. Kathy Campbell announced the Independent Study program will begin offering online instruction in January. Mr. Mier reported the credit recovery program served 65 high school students last year. They are proud to offer services in a creative and alternative setting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMMENTS

Superintendent Campbell commended the Alternative Education. This is the first time we've ever had 100% attendance of the entire staff. A challenge was extended to the other sites.

He thanked Mike Merrill and Titia Ashby for their work on the First Interim report and for providing fiscal stability during these challenging times. Mike Merrill will talk a little bit about trigger cuts tonight. The ability to stay the course and deliver the message in these times has been critical. He commended all staff, stating this has been a very challenging second quarter but we do it day in and day out for our kids. He also commended our music teachers. We are currently in the middle of the frenzy of winter programs. To see elementary, middle and high school kids performing and knowing what the sounded like at the beginning of the year and how much growth and dedication goes into this is amazing. He also recognized Sherri Reusche for her role as the "ring leader" of this particular "circus" as President, and he said he means it with respect and appreciation. To harness this crowd and keeping things moving forward and under control is an art and he thanked her. He also welcomed Zerrall as the new Board President.

For those who don't know, Andy Peters, who oversees our Transportation Department, is leaving us in January. He's taken another position for another district that makes much more sense for him and his family; although a huge loss for us. He was a phenomenal addition who brought some much needed stability. We look to fill that position with a transition to continue that growth. We wish Andy well.

Lastly, we always talk about the power of this staff and this district – 3,300 students and about 400 staff, and when harnessed in a positive direction, our ability to do good for others is amazing. This is particularly true this time of year when the level of need in our community rises to the forefront. This group steps up and does some tremendous work to give back to the community and to give back to each other. You can look specifically at our efforts with food drives, Santa's Express and Christmas to Remember and you see the donations of food, the donations of money, the donations of time and the donations of toys coming from students, staff and parents. We, by far, are the largest single block contributor to this effort. He is humbled and proud every day to work with this amazing group of people. We will sustain that. It's not just what we do for the community but what we do for each other, internally, and you don't always get to see it because it happens all year round and only seems like it magnifies and manifests itself this time of year. That said, so should rise the level of recognition and appreciation for the group of people that we are, who we work with and the people that we serve. He thanked the audience and everyone else out there for the great work they do. Happy Holidays!
