11. Superintendent's Comments

Superintendent Campbell says we are all focusing on day one of the new school year. There are a lot of changes. One of which is the new state funding formula. There are more questions than answers about it. We are also implementing the phases of Common Core Standards, which Lisa McInturf will discuss later. We have 12 new teachers, 3 new administrators and 5 school sites with new principals. Mr. Campbell also informed everyone that the pool was not open for public swim during the summer due to personnel-related issues. His intentions are to have the pool open for public swim during the summer next year.

Ms. Angel reported on her trip to Florida with 13 students. It was a science-oriented trip. Our students were very well behaved. She also attended a training sponsored by CTA with two of our high school math teachers, which addressed teaching kids who are afraid of math. We are the first high school in the program. Ms. Angel will incorporate this with her Integrated Science class. They are having their CUEA meeting at the end of the day on the August 2 CORE Day. She thanked Ric Stitt and Mike Merrill for all the tech equipment installed in the classrooms. The executive board meeting with CUEA is tomorrow. They are setting up their calendar. There was some discussion about the CUSD calendar. Mr. Campbell said there will be a calendar committee and everyone will have a say in future calendars for CUSD's school year. Currently, we only have a calendar through 2014.

1. Approval of Local Teaching Assignment Options

a) Below Grade 9

Education Code Section 44256(b) allows the holder of a Multiple Subject or Standard Elementary Teaching Credential to teach any subject in departmentalized classes below grade 9 if the teacher has twelve semester units or six upper division or graduate semester units or course work in the subject to be taught from an accredited institution by resolution of the governing board and teacher consent. It is recommended the Board adopt the following Resolutions:

<u>Resolution 2013/14-02</u>: Authorizing Teresa Fasola to teach two periods of Journalism at Toyon Middle School for the 2013-14 school year, as she meets all course work requirements and consents to teaching the assignment.

Resolution 2013/14-03: Authorizing Kevin Hesser to teach one period of Landscaping at Toyon Middle School for the 2013-14 school year, as he meets all course work requirements and consents to teaching the assignment.

b) Electives

Education Code Section 44258.7 (c) & (d) allows a full-time teacher with special skills and preparation outside his/her credential authorization to be assigned to teach in an "elective" area of his or her special skills in a full-time assignment, provided the assignment is approved by the local Committee on Assignments prior to the beginning of the assignment and the teacher agrees to the assignment. It is recommended the Board adopt the following resolutions:

Resolution 2013/14-04: Authorizing Rick Behler to teach Video Production classes at Calaveras High School for the 2013-14 school year, as he possesses the skills required and consents to teaching the assignment.

Resolution 2013/14-05: Authorizing Jason Weatherby to teach Sports Conditioning classes at Calaveras High School for the 2013-14 school year, as he possesses the skills required and consents to teaching the assignment.

c) **Departmentalized Class**

Education Code Section 44263 allows the holder of a teaching credential to serve, by resolution of the governing board and with consent of the teacher, in a departmentalized class if the teacher has completed eighteen semester units of course work, or nine semester units of upper division or graduate course work, in the subject to be taught. It is recommended the Board adopt the following resolution:

<u>Resolution 2013/14-06</u>: Authorizing Nichole Markle to teach drama classes at Calaveras High School for the 2013-14 school year, as she meets all course work requirements and consentsto teaching the assignment.

2. <u>Tentative Agreement Between Calaveras Unified School District (CUSD) and Calaveras Area</u> <u>Substitute Teachers Association (CASTA)</u>

The Tentative Agreement entered into with Calaveras Area Substitute Teachers Association was ratified by its membership on June 13, 2013 and was presented to the Board for approval. The required AB1200 public notice was presented to the Board and public on June 25, 2013. It is recommended the Board approve the Tentative Agreement between CUSD and CASTA for the 2013-14 school year.

3. <u>Revision of Job Share at Calaveras High School</u>

It is requested the Board approve a revision to a 50/50 job share between Mikki Koepp and Tammy Lisk at Calaveras High School teaching Physical Education. The job share will be revised to a 27/73 job share. (Koepp is 27% and permanent and Lisk is 73% and temporary.)

1. <u>Revised Job Description for Technology System Analyst</u>

It is recommended the Board approve the revised job description for the Technology System Analyst (formerly Technology Supervisor). There is no change in days or salary placement.

Ms. McInturf gave a report on the Common Core Standards, providing background history and the plan for implementation along with a visual posted in the Board room. She will continue to provide updates.

b. Approval, Memorandum of Understanding with The Resource Connection Early Childhood <u>Programs</u>

It is recommended the Board approve an MOU between Calaveras Unified School District and the Resource Connection Early Childhood Program to facilitate a join State Preschool and Head Start program in West Point.

c. Performing Arts Facility

1) Bond History and Financing

A history of the bond funding and financing was presented.

There was considerable discussion about the various types of bond funding, selling to investors, how much it actually costs the district from community members as well as some community members who said it was a waste of time to have the discussion, as the board has already voted to proceed with the design of the Performing Arts Facility and reminded the

Board this is what the community voted for and that's what we need to use the remaining bond money to fund. Ms. Ashby and Mr. Campbell gave background information, expenditure history and the current status of the bond, including what the money has been spent on and asked anyone who had questions regarding these monies to please ask at any time, as it is a complex system of accounting. They also gave an explanation of the checks and balances of the bond finance system and provided handouts of financial reports.

Board President Bowsher called a 5 minute recess at 6:55 p.m.

2) Discussion of Proposed Design of the Performing Arts Facility

A discussion of proposed design of the Performing Arts Facility will be presented for input.

A group of community members and staff met the prior week to review the plans and provide feedback. Chief Technology Officer Ric Stitt projected images of the architect's renditions of the proposed design of the Performing Arts Facility. There were depictions of different size stages (this is a thrust stage design), the exterior and interior, public bathroom area, small lobby/entrance area, back stage, storage upstairs, two dressing/bathrooms behind stage.

Superintendent Campbell would like to bring the design to the Board for a vote at the August 6 Board meeting.
