#### **Calaveras High School**

Principal Mike Merrill welcomed the Board and introduced staff. He gave an overview of their work on the Common Core Standards, the change to career technical education, where students can apply knowledge learned to the real world. Ag education is a perfect example of a CTE requirement. He introduced Ag teachers Jason Weatherby and Abigail Ferrell.

#### **Agriculture Education Funding**

Teachers Jason Weatherby and Abigail Ferrell discussed the FFA program. Students/Officers of FFA Logan Sullivan, Blake Ehlers, Kylee West, Ashley VanKirk and Laura McGary of FFA gave presentations to the Board as well as parents Sara Rose and Gina Sullivan of the Ag Boosters on the advantages of the program such as learning leadership skills, public speaking skills, opportunities to travel and attend conferences, participate in competitions, raise animals, learn biology, money management and showmanship. They encouraged to Board to continue to keep the program and continue to keep CTE a priority with the Local Control Funding.

A substitute janitor saw the letter on the wall and gave the teacher \$50 to put toward the telescope. The teacher and her husband ordered the telescope from Amazon and presented it to the student. Ms. Angel said there are stories like this throughout the district. They will be negotiating over the next few months and she hopes we remember the kind people who work here, both certificated and classified, who all care about kids. If the district takes care of them, they can take care of the children in this community.

#### **16. CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION**

#### a. Report from Director Lisa McInturf

Ms. McInturf said the training being provided through the San Joaquin County Office of Education will be for 70 K-6 teachers, which amounts to approximately \$20 a teacher. They selected this training because the teachers gave positive feedback from the last training and said they wanted to focus on mathematics. Also, a number of teachers take advantage of Winter intersessions on the Common Core and bring back information to share with the entire staff. There are a number of various trainings occurring throughout the district.

She gave an update on a proposed Senate Bill 837, the Kindergarten Readiness Act, which is an expansion of TK to include all 4-year-olds, beginning in 2015-16. She will keep us posted.

This is testing time: She provided an update on the assessments testing where 11<sup>th</sup> graders can take voluntary tests on writing, reading and mathematics to show their preparedness for college, and if they do well they can avoid certain college placement tests. It is also the time for the physical fitness testing. Science testing for grades 5, 8 and 10.

She and Mr. Stitt will be attending training on the Smarter Balance testing – a test of the tests.
