Kudos to everyone involved, specifically Nichole Markle, Angela Allured and Robert Wise. This is the season to hear 8 different versions of Jingle Bells throughout the last several weeks. It's been tremendous work to allow our kids to shine on many stages throughout the district. It's a great time of year. He passed along his appreciation.

11. Board Member Comments

Sherri Reusche

If you haven't been to the Performing Arts Center, please take time to go see a performance. "Once Upon a Mattress" was performed, and thanks to Karan Bowsher for her hard work, and also to Mrs. Markle. It was funny and the kids are so talented. Ms. Reusche spent the morning at Gold Strike. They are doing a new culinary class. The Columbia College CTE Director came to help the class prepare food. She and trustee Zerrall McDaniel were guests at their lunch, and it was amazing. The kids also did a Thanksgiving meal. These kids are so excited about cooking. She attended the Robotics class at Toyon. They do the software and create these robots and do a Bot competition, where they program their Bots to push the other Bot out of a circle. She was a guest participant with another student and their battery died in the middle of the competition so they had work on figuring out on how to do it differently next time. The teacher was great and every time something happened they had to discuss what they learned and how to fix it. The Resilient Schools Committee has broken everybody out to try and become community hubs. She attended the Jobs and Economics Committee to discuss how businesses can do partnerships with our schools. They talked about how to do job interviews and out of that Delta College will be doing a job fair on March 10 in San Andreas. Last week Delta College was at CHS doing registration for students and adults. Last Saturday she attended Jenny Lind Elementary's Breakfast with Santa and it was a great event packed with participants. The Interact kids from the high school helped on shopping day for Christmas to Remember. Next year she would like to talk about a few things on her list. She would like to talk about math. She thinks having a conversation with the Board about Common Core and traditional and what that looks like. She thinks it's important because as board members they are to make sure all students are successful. She would like to look at the different

kinds of math. We don't have a Curriculum Director at this time. She would like to see what different schools are doing and what's working. Some schools are piloting different things. The news about Mr. Clifton is heartbreaking. There are a lot of community things going on for the family. There are shirts being designed. There's a dinner on January 30. There are bracelets that are going to be out there. All to help their family financially for all they will have to endure. She has a bag of stuff from attending CSBA and would like to hand it over to Mr. Campbell and talk to the Board about it another time. There are two things she is interested in. One is a product called the Tag that is a card that students get and there is software that helps parents to know where the bus is, when it's in route and when the kids get off the bus. Parents can even send a text message if their student is sick. It's very interesting and worth having a discussion about. She doesn't know if we've had issues with our lockboxes, but there are other districts that have had issues with them – the rubber wearing or the screws not holding. There is a new product out that has a bolt. It's the same thing but it locks with a bolt versus it just being rubber. She also wished to clarify a question regarding our special sessions and said we need to do a better job and she apologized to Mrs. Lujan if she felt that she was not heard on their Saturday session. If there are things you would like to add or things you want them to know to please give it to any Board member. They are trying really hard as a Board to fix their protocols and their norms.

She thanked everyone for taking the time to attend the Board meeting. She wanted to talk about something that Sherri Reusche just mentioned (job fair/Delta College) and that is she works for the state – you would know it as a prison. It's a health hospital. They are still hiring and the wages there are good. If you know high school grads who don't want to go to tons of schooling, the Psychiatric Technician program is 18 months, and the starting pay is \$5,000 a month. It's a good start and you and if you earn the Psych Tech certification, you could go into the RN program right after that. RN's are always in need. It's a very good living. There are a lot of office technician jobs that are entry level secretary. You probably want to go to the job fair. Delta College is a lot of the entrance into these positions in the state. If you want to ask her any questions on how to get into the state, she would be more than happy to direct someone.

Zerrall McDaniel

Trustee McDaniel also wishes to thank all the attendees. She likes to see a room full of people at the Board meetings. She visited Rail Road Flat Elementary this week to attend their "Day of Code." It was an amazing program and she gave kudos to teacher Randall Youngblood, who had a group of students in the MPR using a deck of cards, but they were really learning programming. In the library Donna Vial, who is a volunteer up there, was doing coding on the computers. This is something she would like to see expand throughout the entire district. She also attended the Gold Strike Thanksgiving, and she thinks this is a program that motivates the kids. She also attended the culinary event at Gold Strike with Klaus, the CTE Director at Columbia College. That's another program she would like to see expand within our district. She also wanted to say her thoughts for Mr. Clifton and hopes everybody is thinking of him and his family. She attended CSBA as a Delegate the first week of December. She's looking forward to making the report and does not want to wait until their first study session. She would like to begin conversations in this year about how to start generating money in this district. It's frustrating to go from one budget to the next always wondering what the state is going to do. She wants to be able to build programs, lower class sizes,

Gregory Gustafson

Trustee Gustafson wished everybody a Happy Holiday. His thoughts and prayer are with Mr. Clifton. He attended a couple of the musical plays at the Performing Arts Center. He knows he voted against it even though he knows we needed it. He just didn't feel it was large enough in capacity nor had been thoroughly thought out in its design and application to the school. Although those presentations were great, neither music teacher knew how to turn on a microphone for the presentations, so they hand-carried out a box and left it there. There were no manuals in the room. No real training took place for that so it was kind of unfortunate. He did notice all the people parked up above in the teacher parking and all the surrounds, possibly blocking fire lanes. We need to either paint red curbs or something to that effect. It could be a problem in the case of an emergency. The people seemed to be frustrated coming up the stairs and be dumped right out onto the roadway rather than having a sidewalk or something to walk up to, so that's what promoted most people to park up above and walk down into the building that way. Most people walking into the building had wonderful, happy expressions on their face, glad to be able to watch the kids in that venue, but another set of stairs coming down from the middle of that parking lot would promote people to park down there. It could be maybe from the middle of the parking lot so no one has to walk from one end of the parking lot to the other end of the parking lot. They could just walk to the middle space and up. Perhaps we could do this in the future because he has noticed we've exhausted the entire budget to build the Performing Arts Center. It's wonderful because the kids are dressed up. Mr. Wise donned a suit. It elevated everyone into a new level perhaps. They enjoyed playing. They had rotating drummers. You could stand out in front of your parents and see them now. The seats are elevated and you can see your students. It's a wonderful thing. He doesn't know how we are going to proceed because the play cost money but the musical performances didn't, so is there going to be a balance that we're going to take to cover the cost? Angela mentioned we need to vacuum already so maintenance is already a real marginal need there but the way it was designed makes it for minimum maintenance, which is a good thing. He hopes everyone will have a good holiday and enjoy their families.

Trustee Bowsher got to see the West Point Elementary performance last night. It's always nice to see the MPR totally packed with people and all the little girls in their frilly dresses. She did work on "Once Upon a Mattress." She had a wonderful time with the kids. She is a theater arts major. She has some Masters work as well but has not finished it. She has worked in a number of theaters and this is a fabulous facility. There are some glitches, and she's never worked in a theater that didn't have glitches because once it's all built you go "oh." When everything is on paper it looks one way. It really is a terrific, useable facility. She cried the opening night because it was so exciting. She helped to build the first theater. When she was in high school at CHS they built that little black box theater in the classroom. She built the old proscenium with kids up there. It was pretty exciting to get to walk into a new theater. They started a protocol with "Once Upon a Mattress." The last night is called "strike," and their strike was to clean every surface. They vacuumed, mopped all the floors, washed all the windows and cleaned all the hand rails. With that protocol and 40 kids it happens in about 20 minutes. At this point Angela is saying there is no food or drink in the

auditorium. She did get some people cranky when she asked them to step into the lobby. It's beautiful. Go see it. She attended Masters in Governance training through CSBA. She spent 2 days in Sacramento. Those classes are very valuable. You are sitting at tables with other Board members and superintendents from different districts throughout the state. And here's what she learned: There is not a utopian school district. Every single person had the exact same difficulties, concerns and challenges that we have. No one had enough money. No one had small enough class sizes. No one had all that they wanted to have. What really struck home with her was that she was sitting at a table with a new Board member from a school district in Southern California who was doing quite a bit of ranting about his district and his superintendent. He was quite negative. Another member who she spoke to later from a neighboring district from that new school board member's said that particular district is one of the top 3 districts in the nation. In the nation – not just the state! It's an amazing school district that outscores people left and right. So she asked, do they have a new superintendent, and he said no. The superintendent has been there 26 years. So she's thinking top in the nation, and she doesn't think she would find much to complain about. We all have so many challenges. We need to keep our focus on our district, on our kids, on the challenges in front of us. We need to work on those. We need to be as proactive as we can. While we are doing that, don't lose the big picture. We're not the bottom of the barrel doing it all wrong while everyone else is doing everything all fabulous. We are all struggling. If we keep the idea that we are all struggling together, we will work for the common good. It's never going to be everything we want it to be because every single person in this room has a different idea of what perfect is. None of us sees perfect the same. We have to struggle and work and support each other.

19. PERSONNEL

Renetta Hale, teacher and VP of CUEA, said they had a very successful training with their CTA contact person Annie Aquino. After a year of advocating for students, the era of “No Child Left Behind” is gone. President Obama signed the Bill December 10 and the Senate overwhelmingly passed the Bill. Now there will be changes and we will not be so test driven.

b) Classified Report (Scott Grutzmacher)

Scott Grutzmacher, Shop Steward for CSEA, said he was going to thank Jeanie Kancianich and Madeline Perpignan for their time but they snuck out on us. They have some training coming up for lead custodians. The Paraeducators attended training in November, and there will be another one in the Spring with the date to be announced. He asked if they (Paraeducators) were eligible for reimbursement for classes when they go out of town overnight to training or conferences.

Marcelle Papp, Paraeducator, clarified that there is a Paraeducator Conference coming up, and it’s always very difficult to get funding. Superintendent Campbell said he is aware their unit has put in a request for consideration, but they have not had an opportunity to address it yet, but plan to do so. Ms. Papp said she was not aware of that.

Mr. Grutzmacher continued with his report. They have a new Food Service Manager at the high school. There has also been some training for school nutrition employees. They have to go to this new training plus get 10 hours each year of continued education. The lunch count at the high school is up. Maintenance has training for the new units at the Performing Arts Center. Half the crew will go to training with L&H, the company that installed and has all the knowledge on these new machines. Then eventually they will send the other half of the crew (HVAC units).

The First Interim Report, as of October 31, 2015, was presented for Board approval on a qualified certification. (This report is linked to the agenda online at www.calaveras.k12.ca.us.)

Trustee Smith asked what does a “yes” mean? Superintendent Campbell said it means you accept the report as presented. Trustee Smith said does that mean she accepts all the numbers are correct because she doesn’t know where they numbers came from. She asked if she would be accepting that it was given to her and explained to her. She doesn’t know what she is agreeing to. Superintendent Campbell said she is not agreeing to how we placed the money into the pieces of the pie are necessarily her priority, but what you are approved is that the numbers as presented by Fiscal Director Booth and the Business Department as of October 31, 2015 are accurate. That requires a degree of trust but through the annual cycle, the constant reporting, answering of questions, hoping we are able to close that gap so there is that degree of trust, that the numbers being presented and the additional external oversight by the county office and by the auditors would reflect the fact that the numbers are presented as accurate. He can’t make her believe them, so the district is asking for her approval that the report is accurate as submitted, but it’s an ongoing check and balance that exists to make sure that our practices and our data are accurate.
