

Program Improvement Notification 2013 / 2014

NCLB requires the state and district to review annually the academic progress of federally funded Title I schools and to identify schools in need of improvement. These schools are identified as Program Improvement (PI) schools after two consecutive years of not making adequate yearly progress (AYP). Currently, Toyon Middle School is in Program Improvement year 1; Community Day School, Program Improvement year 2; Valley Springs Elementary and West Point Elementary, Program Improvement year 3; San Andreas Elementary, Program Improvement year 5.

School Choice: All parents/guardians of students attending a PI school have the right to request a transfer of their child(ren) to a non-PI district school with district-provided transportation.

For parents who select this option, the district will provide transportation to the non-PI school for as long as the home school continues to be identified as a PI school. If the demand for transfers exceeds funds available, priority will be given to the lowest achieving, low-income students.

**For the 2013 / 2014 school year, San Andreas Elementary, Valley Springs Elementary, and West Point Elementary students are eligible for School Choice transfer.

No (0) students have elected to transfer schools in the 2013/2014 year for Program Improvement reasons.

Supplemental Choice Providers: Supplemental educational services (SES) refer to extra academic help available to eligible students attending a school in Program Improvement, years 2+ (currently San Andreas Elementary, Valley Springs Elementary, West Point Elementary and Community Day School). This extra help can be provided before or after school at no charge to the family. If the demand for services exceeds funds available, priority will be given to the lowest achieving, low-income students. Parents choose from a list of state approved providers. Each provider indicates the location(s) where SES are provided, as well as information about serving students with disabilities and/or English Learners.

For the 2013/2014 school year, 873 students are eligible to apply for Supplemental Services. Sixty-four (64) students have applied for services.
