

Program Improvement Notification 2012 / 2013

NCLB requires the state and district to review annually the academic progress of federally funded Title I schools and to identify schools in need of improvement. These schools are identified as Program Improvement (PI) schools after two consecutive years of not making adequate yearly progress (AYP). Currently, Valley Springs Elementary and West Point Elementary are in Program Improvement, year 2. San Andreas Elementary is in Program Improvement, year 4.

School Choice: All parents/guardians of students attending a PI school have the right to request a transfer of their child(ren) to a non-PI district school with district-paid transportation.

For parents who select this option, the district will provide transportation to the non-PI school for as long as the home school continues to be identified as a PI school. If the demand for transfers exceeds funds available, priority will be given to the lowest achieving, low-income students.

**For the 2012 / 2013 school year, San Andreas Elementary, Valley Springs Elementary, and West Point Elementary students are eligible for School Choice transfer.

No (0) students have elected to transfer schools for Program Improvement reasons.

Supplemental Choice Providers: Supplemental educational services (SES) refer to extra academic help available to eligible students attending a school in Program Improvement, years 2+ (currently San Andreas Elementary, Valley Springs Elementary, West Point Elementary). This extra help can be provided before or after school at no charge to the family. If the demand for services exceeds funds available, priority will be given to the lowest achieving, low-income students.

Each provider indicates the location(s) where SES are provided, as well as information about serving students with disabilities and/or English Learners.

For the 2012 / 2013 school year, 491 students are eligible to apply for Supplemental Services.

Thirty-four (34) students have applied for services.
